Atonement =

- wiping clean or
- paying a ransom price

"OLAH" which means "to arise"

Sacrifice is at the core of the Christian faith

...on the day you eat from it, you will certainly die. Genesis 2:17

What is the purpose of the burnt offering?

- Confess because of our general state of sinfulness/depravity
- Convey an attitude of surrender/humility
- I have nothing in myself to offer

When we worship our <u>heart</u> needs to be <u>right</u>

You do not delight in sacrifice and offering...you do not ask for a whole burnt offering...I delight to do your will, my God; Your instruction lives within me.

Psalm 40:6-8

When we worship our <u>heart</u> needs to be <u>right</u>

- Obedience
- Trust
- Repentance

You do not want a sacrifice, or I would give it; you are not pleased with a burnt offering. The sacrifice pleasing to God is a broken spirit. You will not despise a broken and humbled heart, God. Psalm 51:16, 17

What should I bring before the LORD when I come to bow before God on high? Should I come before him with burnt offerings, with year-old calves? Would the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams or with ten thousand streams of oil? Should I give my firstborn for my transgression, the offspring of my body for my own sin?
