Questions To Think About

- 1. Read Matthew 5:31-32. Have you, yourself or anyone close to you experienced a divorce? What has been the impact?

- 3. Read Matthew 19:3-6. Jesus doesn't answer their question. Why do you think Jesus emphasizes faithfulness in marriage? What does it reveal about God's character and intention for marriage?
- 4. How should Christians approach marriage, knowing that Jesus takes it very seriously?
- 5. What does Jesus mean by "sexual immorality" in marriage, and why is it given as grounds for divorce?
- 6. How might these verses apply in today's world, where marriage and divorce are viewed differently than in Jesus' day?
- 7. What role does forgiveness and reconciliation play when marriage becomes difficult, according to the Bible?
- 8. Jesus mentions divorce as a last resort for unfaithfulness. How can couples strengthen their marriage to avoid reaching that point?
- 9. If someone you know is struggling in their marriage, how might you support and encourage them in a way that honors these teachings?
