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Questions to think about...

- Read James 2:1-13. James warns against showing favoritism. Can you share a time when you noticed favoritism—either in the church, at work, or in another community?
- 2. Why do you think favoritism is such a common problem for humans, even among believers?
- 3. Read 1 Samuel 16:7. How do you apply this? How does this challenge the way you view and treat others in your daily life?
- 4. How might favoritism show up in our church or small group settings today? What are some subtle ways it could sneak in?
- 5. James 2:5–7 highlights that God chooses the marginalized—how should this shape the way we honor the very people society tends to overlook or dismiss?"
- 6. James 2:8-11 says we are to "Love your neighbor as yourself." How does favoritism break this law? Can you think of everyday examples where showing partiality could violate this command?
- 7. Why is it important to apply God's commands consistently in how we treat others, not selectively?
- 8. What is one concrete way you can show mercy or resist favoritism in your church, workplace, or neighborhood this week?
- 9. How does remembering that we all stand equally in need of God's mercy (rich, poor, insider, outsider) shape your view of community and your responsibility in it?
